Reflection on the Readings

“Today’s readings concern division: Adam separated from God; Paul speaks of the ‘inner man’ and ‘outer man’; the Gospel tells of a kingdom divided against itself. In Eden we get the first case of BSE – Blame Someone Else. Adam blames God for putting the woman with him, the Woman blames the serpent. The Sacrament of Confession heals us because in it we admit our sins truthfully. Through this channel open to truth the Holy Spirit of Truth gifts Himself into us with healing and freedom. In Genesis are two accounts of creation: 1. the overview summary; 2. a detailed account of man’s creation and fall. In the first is man made in God’s heavenly image and likeness and in the second man is made from the dust of the earth. St Paul understood this as one man for our personal experience is that we are two people. One wants to do good and the ‘other’ does not do it. Paul calls them the ‘inner man’ (soul; heavenly) and the ‘outer man’ (earthly; fleshy). If there is someone who still bears the image of the earthly according to the ‘outer man’, he is led by an earthly desire and love. But the person who bears the image of the heavenly according to the ‘inner man’ is led by a heavenly desire and love (cf 1Cor. 15:49) The latter happens when once the beauty and glory of the Word of God has been perceived and we fall in love with His splendour for this Word is the image and brightness of the invisible God. The Commandments, Gospel and Church are the means to heal us and re-establish that harmony and wholeness of soul, mind and body as it was before the fall: restore the earthly man to the full control of the Heavenly man. Jesus in the Gospel warns us against Satan the divider. Satan allegorised as a snake with divided tongue is most apt for he began by causing the division between the heavenly man and the fleshy man within man himself and continues to do it throughout the centuries by using it to divide families and countries by blame and consequent war and suffering.”
